Marti Bennett is the Food and Beverage Manager at Shoreland, and will provide excellent leadership in our restaurant. He is excited to meet everyone at Shoreland and looks forward to serving you.

Shoreland Country Club offers memberships, public play, and dining. Your membership also includes the driving range to warm up before you play or for you to work on your game. PGA Professional, John Hamilton, offers instruction for \$60 for adults, and \$40 for juniors (17 & under). Lessons are 45 minutes long and are helpful and entertaining. Lessons will also include video swing analysis.

New for 2025 are two Shoreland Junior camps. These camps are Monday through Thursday for one hour each day. The camps are divided by age and are limited to 10 juniors in each group to provide lots of individual help for everyone. Cost is \$50 for the four, one-hour group lessons. Call the golf shop to enter at 507-931-4400 ext. 1. The first camp is June 16th through the 19th, the second camp is July 14th through the 17th, more details regarding these camps are on our website.

Hours of Operation and Tee Times

Pro Shop Hours

The pro shop will be open 15 minutes before the first tee time of the day and will remain open until dark. The first tee time of the day are as follows:

March and April: Weather dependent

May: 8:00 am

June-August: 6:30 am

September-October: 8:00 am

Tee Times

Tee times can be made up to 14 days in advance and can be booked in-person, online, or by telephone. Please call: 507-931-4400, ext. 1 to reach the pro shop. To make an online tee time visit our website: www.shorelandcc.com, click on the tee time tab and follow the below steps:

1. Select the Member Tee Time Selection
2. Put in the Password (This is available to Members Only, so please ask the pro shop staff for the password)
3. Create a profile using the same email given on your membership application
4. Select the tee time and amount of players you will have and book the tee time

By using the Member Tee Time portal, no fees will be charged to book your tee time. To cancel tee times, please call the Pro Shop.

At times, there will only be 9-Holes available due to leagues or other events. The online tee times will state at the bottom of each block if they are available for 9 or 18 holes.

Restricted Days and Times

Mondays: Couple's League runs June through mid-August. The course is closed from 4:00-8:00 pm.

Tuesdays: 2-Man Men's League begins May 13th. 9 holes only after 3:00 pm.

Wednesdays: Men's Day standing tee times are available 11:00am-6:30pm for men 18 and over. The course is open to all for tee times before and after the restricted time.

Thursday mornings: Women's morning standing tee times are available 9:00am-10:00am for ladies beginning in May. The course is open to all for tee times before and after the morning league.

Thursday evenings: Women's League begins May 15th, 9 holes only after 3:00 pm.

2025 League Information:

Monday- Couple's League

Cost: \$350 for Members and \$475 for Non-Members

Includes: Golf, food, and prizes for the season (cart not included but required)

Dates/Times: Start date is June 2nd and will run for 10 total weeks. The last night of the official couples league will be on August 4th.

Tuesday- Men's 9-Hole League (2-Man)

Cost: \$100/Player

Includes: Prizes and handicap for the season (Green Fees are NOT INCLUDED)

Dates/Times: Start date is May 13th and will run for 14 weeks ending on August 19th.

Format: Each player will play their own ball the entire match. Teams are awarded one point on each hole for both low ball and low total. A half point will be given to each side when there is a tie. Two points will be given to the team with the lowest overall net total for the entire match. The handicap strokes given will go off of the low player in the match. Each match is played for a total of 20 points.

Thursday Morning Women's

This league is a very informal affair. You don't have to sign up to participate, just show up and be paired in a group upon arrival. We will start each week at 9am. This league will start May 8th. Each week we have a game of the day, given out by the Golf Pro.

Thursday Women's 9-Hole League (2-Gal)

Cost: \$50

Includes: Prizes for the season (Green Fees are NOT INCLUDED)

Dates/Times: Start date is May 15th and will run for 12 weeks ending on August 21st. We will shotgun at 5:45pm each week. We will play a 2-Gal Scramble format. This is a casual fun affair open to players of all levels of play.

Golf Course, Facilities, and Membership Information

Golf Course

Shoreland Country Club has 4 sets of tees to fit any level of play, including a set of family tees which give younger players and beginners a shorter course to play to help with pace of play. The family tee scorecards are available in the pro shop. The standard pace of play is 3 hours and 45 minutes for 18 holes, and 1 hour and 50 minutes for 9 holes.

Driving Range

The driving range holds the same hours as the pro shop, but will be closed for maintenance hours Wednesdays at 5:00 pm-Thursdays after mowing is finished. Driving range balls may be picked up in the Pro shop and empty bags can be returned in the return bucket on the range. Any unused range balls must be left on the range for collection. Keeping extra bags of range balls is strictly forbidden.

Swimming Pool

The pool season runs from Memorial Day weekend through Labor Day weekend. During the season, the pool is open with the following hours:

Monday: 12:00 pm-9:00 pm

Tuesday-Sunday: 9:00 am-9:00 pm

All Members must check in with the Clubhouse staff at Lakeside before entering the pool area. All guests must be accompanied by a member. Outside food and beverage is prohibited.

Guest Passes

Full Single memberships at Shoreland will receive 2 discounted guest passes, and Full Family memberships will receive 4 discounted guest passes. Each pass entitles your accompanied guest to a rate of \$30 for 18 holes including their seat in a cart. The accompanied member must be in the group with their guest. Youth, Single 19-29, Family 20+, and Social Pool memberships do not qualify for guest passes.

Reciprocal Cards

Reciprocal cards are available to all full memberships, excluding youth. With the reciprocal program, members receive a discounted rate for 18 holes, including carts, at 8 area courses. The contact information for each course can be found on the back of the cards, the program allows 2 visits per season at each course.

New Food and Beverage Minimum

Beginning April and running through December 2025, a \$50 monthly food and beverage minimum will be implemented for each membership (1 minimum for a single, 1 minimum for a family). In 2026, the minimum will be effective January-December. All food and beverage purchases charged to your member number will count toward your monthly minimum. When turning in your 2025 membership, please see John in the pro shop to put a credit card on file to allow charges to be applied directly to your member account. For our members who head south for the winter, gift cards purchased between December and February will count toward your minimum. Credit cards will continue to be charged weekly, and in April and beyond. If your monthly spending falls short (e.g., \$45), the remaining balance (e.g., \$5) will be charged to your card at the end of the month. Shoreland Country Club - Code of Conduct

Introduction

Shoreland Country Club and Lakeside Restaurant foster a culture that values, appreciates, and respects all members, their families, guests, and staff. Members and guests shall conduct themselves in a manner consistent with these values. The intention of this document is to establish clear and acceptable behavior expectations for members and guests of Shoreland Country Club. It is not intended to restrict the rights of anyone but rather to ensure that all members and guests can expect to feel safe and to be treated with respect while at the club. The club deems that upon payment of membership or green fees, all members and guests have given their consent to be bound by both the restrictions and penalties imposed by this code of conduct.

Code of Conduct

All members and guests shall:

- Observe proper golf etiquette, adhere to the dress code, and obey club rules:
 - Sign in at the Pro Shop
 - Rental and safe operation of carts in designated areas only
 - Obeying all signage on the golf course and golf carts
- Not consume outside alcohol on the property at any time.
- Respect the golf course and facilities and not deliberately or carelessly damage or destroy any Shoreland Country Club or Lakeside property or the property of any member, guest, or staff member.
- Not engage in a manner likely to harm the welfare, safety, or reputation of the club.
- Treat Shoreland Country Club staff members in a respectful manner.
- Not conduct themselves in any rude or immoral manner, including the use of profane language, gestures, insults or excessively loud or otherwise inappropriate behavior.
- Not harass, provoke, or threaten, verbally or physically, any member, guest, or staff member. Sexual harassment of any kind will not be tolerated. Sexual harassment includes any conduct, comment, gesture or contact of a sexual nature that is found offensive. Although the offender may not perceive their comments or actions to be discriminatory or unwelcome because the defender did not communicate their discomfort, this does not excuse the behavior.

Resolution

Should a violation occur, members and guests shall cooperate in a courteous and respectful manner with management and Board of Directors regarding any review or investigation. Failure to observe and abide by the Code of Conduct may result in:

- Issuance of a verbal warning.
- Issuance of a written warning.
- Suspension of his/her playing privileges for a defined period of time.
- Permanent suspension of his/her playing privileges.
- Forfeiture of all fees paid.
- Removal from the facility.
- Monetary restitution for damage to property.
